Audio Descriptions in iTunes

Did you know that iTunes has lots of movies and other media available with Audio Descriptions?

Audio Descriptions describe what's happening on the screen and are a fantastic way to make sure you don't miss anything. **Try it out!**

Finding Movies with Audio Descriptions in iTunes

1. Open your **iTunes** app. The focus is on the **Search** tab at the bottom of the screen.

Tip: The Search feature allows you to search the entire iTunes store for media. Once you find something you like, you can purchase and download the media right to your device.

2. Touch the **Search** field at the top of the screen. Then double tap to enter the edit field.

3. Type “Audio Descriptions” in the edit field.
4. Touch the **Search** button at the bottom right of the keyboard. Then double tap to perform the search.
5. The **Search Results** screen appears with the focus in the **Search** edit field.

Filtering Search Results

6. There are three buttons just below the **Search** edit field for filtering your results:
 - **All**: Unfiltered list that displays all iTunes products containing your search keywords.
 - **Movies**: Displays only movies that contain the keywords.
 - **More**: Displays a list of additional filtering options, including **Audiobooks**, **Books**, **TV Episodes**, **Albums**, and **Podcasts**.
7. Right swipe once to move to the **All** button. Your search results are grouped by category.

Tip: VoiceOver announces that All is selected. All is the default search result view, so you don't have to double tap to select it.

8. Right swipe to move to the **Movies** button and then double tap to select it.

Exploring Results

9. Right swipe past the **More** button to the first movie in the results list.

Tip: VoiceOver announces the movie name, genre, release date, ratings, and number of reviews.

10. Double tap to open the movie's details screen. The focus is on the banner image for the movie.

Tip: Before you purchase or rent any movie, swipe through the detail screen to make sure there is an audio description label. That way you'll know for sure that your movie contains audio descriptions.

11. Right swipe through the movie details and costs until VoiceOver announces you've reached the accessibility tags.
12. Swipe through the accessibility tags until you reach the **Audio Description** tag. If you move past the accessibility tags without landing on **Audio Description**, the movie does not offer that feature.

Tip: If you wanted to purchase or rent this movie, you would left swipe back to the Purchase or Rent buttons and double tap to begin the process.
