Getting Online

Navigating Websites

There are simple ways to navigate between multiple web pages.

If you're new to using links and the address bar, you may want to check out the workshop on website basics. **See how these options work for you.**

1. When you have a website open and want to open a new browser session, you can use the mouse pointer to select the plus sign to the right of your current tab to open a new tab.
2. Another method to open a new browsing session is to use the keyboard shortcut of **Control** and the letter **T** for tab.
3. Now that you have two tabs open, you can move between the two. Use your mouse pointer

to select the tab on the left or use the keyboard shortcut of **Control** plus **Tab**.

4. To close the current window without closing the browser, use the keyboard shortcut **Control** plus **F4**.
5. **Sidebars:** Many websites use vertical menus to highlight links, a directory, or service offering. When you select the link, you are directed to a new browsing window with details about a particular topic.

You may be surprised at all the options you have for navigating different web pages. Take a look at any you haven't used before and see how helpful they can be. Other workshops in this series explore more ways to navigate the Internet. Try them out!

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
