Accessibility Suite

Android Accessibility Suite is a set of accessibility apps designed so people with disabilities—such as vision loss—can use Android devices with ease.

Accessibility Suite is usually preloaded on devices using **version Android 9 or later**. It also includes the **Accessibility Menu** and features such as **Talkback**, **Magnification**, and **Select to Speak**.

To ensure the accessibility features work properly, it's important to keep the **Android Accessibility Suite** updated. Check for updates in the **Google Play Store**.

If an update is available, an **Update** button appears on the app page. Select **Update** to get the latest version. If there is no **Update** button, your device has the most current version.

If you don't have the **Accessibility Suite**, follow the steps below to download it.

Download Android Accessibility Suite

1. Open the **Google Play Store** app.
2. Select the **Apps** button.

Tip: The Apps button is the second button from the left in the row of buttons above the Navigation bar at the bottom of your screen.

3. Enter **Android Accessibility Suite** in the **Search Apps** edit box at the top of the screen.
4. Tap the **Search** icon (looks like a magnifying glass) at the bottom right of the keyboard.
5. Select **Android Accessibility Suite** from the search results list.

Tip: If the Accessibility Suite is already on your device, an Uninstall button appears on the app page in the Play Store.

6. Select **Install**.
