

Adapting Cards for Game Play

1. Snip off the top righthand corner of each card. This helps you hold the cards so they're facing you and right side up.
2. When you get a card game, ask someone to read the cards to you one at a time. If you're a tactile learner, use a braille writer or slate and stylus to label the cards in braille. You can also use adhesive labels. Ask a learning expert where to buy brailleable labels.
3. Use abbreviations like "qc" for "queen of clubs" when labeling cards in braille. This lets you read the cards quickly.
4. Use tactile stickers to label cards if print is difficult and you haven't learned to read braille yet.
