

Labeling and Organizing Nail Polish

So you can always choose the color nail polish you want, attach labels to the different bottles. Use large print or audio labels, or labels you can touch. For example, to tell peach from coral, put a piece of masking tape on the peach bottle, and write a large print letter “P” on the tape. You could also write directly on the bottle with a permanent marker, but the tape may give a better background and help the print stand out. **[Check out Hadley workshops on labeling to discover more ideas and find what works best for you.](#)**

You can also use a smartphone app to connect with someone who can give visual assistance. This person can tell you the color of the polish. Some apps even identify colors. **[Explore Hadley’s assistive technology videos and workshops to learn more about these options.](#)**

You can organize your colors in different ways, too. For example, store light colors in a small, round basket, and dark colors in a plastic square box. Or keep the light pink next to the red on a shelf so you can easily see the difference.
