iPhone/iPad VoiceOver: Search the Web

Did you know that VoiceOver makes it easy to search the web?

Safari is Apple's built-in web browser, and with VoiceOver you can use it for browsing or searching for information on the internet. **Try it out!**

Opening the Safari Browser

1. Tap the **Safari** icon, usually found in the dock at the bottom of your device screen.

Tip: If you've recently used Safari, it will open on the last web page you visited.

2. Tap the **address bar**, which is at the top or bottom of your screen, depending on your settings.

Tip: The address bar can be used to enter web addresses or search terms.

3. If Safari opened on a website, VoiceOver speaks the web address and says that you can double tap the address bar to show your controls.
4. Double tap the address bar. The focus is on the **Search** edit field and the keyboard appears on screen.

Searching the Web

5. Type the search term, “**macular degeneration**,” or a different term, and then double tap the **Go** button at the bottom right corner of your keyboard.
6. Google is Safari’s default search engine, so a **Google search results** page appears.
7. Search results are listed by headings. So set up your **Rotor** to move by headings by choosing its **Headings** element.
8. VoiceOver announces the number of headings in your search results. Swipe down the screen to move through the headings.
9. When you find one that interests you, double tap on it to open the page.

10. Right swipe through the screen to check out what's on the page.
11. Double tap the **Back** button at the bottom left of your device screen to go back to your search results page.
12. To perform a new search, double tap the address bar again and type something new.
