iPhone/iPad VoiceOver: Safari Reader

Apple's Safari Reader makes it easier to read internet articles.

Safari Reader is one of your device's lesser-known features. It removes all the clutter of ads and images within an article, so you're only given the text. **Try it out!**

Starting Safari Reader

1. Go to a website that interests you and open an article.

Tip: News websites are reliable options. Be sure to open the article itself.

2. VoiceOver announces that **Reader** is available. To turn it on, touch the **Page Settings** button on the left side of the address bar.
3. Swipe down until you hear **Show Reader View**. Then double tap to open **Safari Reader**.

Tip: If Reader View is not available, it means the web page you chose doesn't work with the Reader. Open an article on a different website.

4. To start the **Reader**, swipe down the screen using two fingers.
5. Listen to the **Reader** read your article.
6. To pause **Safari Reader**, tap your device screen once with two fingers.

Closing Safari Reader

7. To close the **Reader**, use the **Scrub** gesture or go back to **Page Settings** and swipe down until you hear **Hide Reader**.
8. When the **Reader** closes, you are back to the standard view of your article.
