Apple TV

Low Vision Accessibility

Did you know there are low vision features built right into your Apple TV?

Here are some steps to help you use them and improve your Apple TV experience. **It's worthwhile to check them out.**

1. On your home screen, activate your Settings menu. Use the right flick gesture across the top of your remote.

Press the surface of your remote to open the General Settings.

2. Flick down to find the Accessibility button and then press to open it.
3. Flick down to Zoom, the magnification feature.

4. Flick down to the Display Accommodations settings and press on it. To use any of the features, press its button to turn it on. Press the button again when you want to turn it off.

Tip: Press the Menu button on your Siri Remote to return to the Display Accommodations list.

5. **Color Filters:** Flick up and down the list to explore the color combinations and adjust the Apple TV to your preference.
6. **Light Sensitivity:** Press this button to dim your screen and reduce glare while the color intensity stays the same.
7. **Reduce White Point:** Press this button to open the Reduce White Point settings. This dims your screen and reduces the intensity of bright colors.
8. Press the Menu button to return to Display Accommodations, and then once more to navigate back to the Accessibility settings.

9. **Bold Text:** This feature helps make thin fonts easier to see by boldfacing them.

Tip: Changing Bold Text will require your Apple TV to restart.

10. **Increase Contrast:** This feature can improve visibility for users with low vision.
 - a. **Reduce Transparency:** This helps distinguish the background from the important text. All the transparent backgrounds appear solid, which helps reduce visual clutter.
 - b. **Focus Style:** Apple TV lets you choose between your default focus style and a high-contrast style. Selecting high contrast gives your text a sharp, clear, and defined edge.
11. **Reduce Motion:** This turns off motion effects when you activate or close any of your applications.

Take some time to try out these handy low vision features and see if they improve your experience. Then when you're comfortable, try another workshop like this one to further expand the ways you use your Apple TV.

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
