Siri for Phone Calls

You can easily place a phone call using Siri.

Apple calls Siri a personal assistant. Siri helps you do things like place a phone call, set calendar appointments, get walking directions, and send a text message. **Try using Siri to make a phone call!**

Tip: Siri is usually turned on during the setup process for your device. But if you haven't yet set up Siri, contact a Hadley learning expert for help.

Tip: To get the most interaction from Siri, make sure VoiceOver (Apple's built-in screen reading software) is running on your device. If you're not familiar with VoiceOver, check out the Listen with VoiceOver series.

Using Siri to Make a Phone Call

1. Choose a person to call who is in your **Contacts** app already.
2. Then, say, "Hey, Siri, call [Contact Name]"

Tip: For example, if you had a friend named Kai in your Contacts, you would say, "Hey Siri, call Kai." You can also call someone not in your Contacts by speaking the phone number. For example, "Siri, call 555-123-4567."

Tip: Saying “Siri” or “Hey Siri” depends on how you set up the Siri feature on your device. For help setting up Siri, contact a Hadley learning expert.

3. Siri will say, “Calling,” and then repeat the name or the number that you spoke.
4. To end or hang up the call:
 - Do a two-finger double-tap on the screen.
 - Or, use Siri again by saying, “Siri, hang up.”
