High Contrast Text

You can make your phone or other Android device easier to use by setting the **High contrast text** feature.

This feature makes text easier to see on busy or colorful backgrounds, reducing eye fatigue. **Follow these easy steps to set it up yourself.**

1. On the home screen, tap the **Settings** app to open it.
2. Scroll down to the **Accessibility** settings. Tap the **Accessibility** option to see the settings.
3. Scroll down below the **Display** heading to find the **Display size and text** option and tap it.

Tip: Some phones might say **Text and display** instead.

4. Scroll down to the bottom of the list to find your **High contrast text** button. This feature changes gray or colored text to black or white,

and it adds a contrasting outline when text is on busy or colored background. Tap it to turn it on.

5. Return to your home screen and check out a few apps to see how this feature helps you.

So how did you do with that? It's nice that once you've set it up, the High contrast text feature works for all the apps across your phone.

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
