Adding Elements to the Rotor

Customizing your rotor is another way to make your iPhone, iPad, or iPod Touch easier for you to use.

These steps let you add elements to your rotor on your Apple device. The rotor lets you move more quickly through the different types of elements. You need to add some elements to the rotor yourself before you can use it to reach them. If you're not familiar with how the rotor works, check out Hadley's workshop on using the rotor. **These steps specifically show you how to add "Speaking Rate" and "Volume" to your accessibility rotor.**

Adding Speaking Rate and Volume

1. With VoiceOver on, swipe to the **Settings** app. Tap twice with one finger (single-finger double tap) to open the **Settings** app.

2. Right swipe to your **Accessibility** button, and single-finger double tap it to open a list of your **Accessibility** options.
3. Right swipe to your **VoiceOver** button. Single-finger double-tap to open your **VoiceOver** settings.
4. Right swipe to the **Rotor** button. Single-finger double-tap to open the **Rotor** button.
5. Right swipe through the list to see your rotor elements.

Tip: The Reorder option lets you rearrange your rotor elements as you prefer.

6. Right swipe to **Speaking Rate**. To add this element to the rotor, single-finger double-tap it to select it. It now appears in your rotor.

Tip: Once you find Speaking Rate, you can swipe up or down to speed up or slow down your VoiceOver speaking rate.

7. Right swipe to **Volume**. Single-finger double-tap to add **Volume** to your rotor.

You've just added two new elements—**Speaking Rate** and **Volume**—to your rotor. That's how easy it is to add items to your rotor and make it very useful for you.
