

Mac Low Vision

Appearance in Zoom Styles

Change how the zoomed image appears as you move the cursor around the screen.

1. Open the **Apple** menu and select **System Settings**.
2. Select **Accessibility** from the left panel.
3. Next, select **Zoom** on the right and scroll down to **Zoom Styles**.
4. Select the **Advanced** button.
5. **Zoom Image Moves**, below the **Appearance** header, shows three options:
 - **Continuously with Pointer:** Screen image moves as you move the pointer around the screen. The pointer is easy to follow, but there is a lot of motion on the screen as the image moves around.
 - **When Pointer Reaches Edge:** Screen image doesn't move until the pointer reaches the edge of the screen. There is less motion on the screen than with the previous option.
 - **To Keep Pointer Centered:** Center point of screen image stays with the pointer. Frequent movement of screen image, but pointer is easy to find.

6. Choose one of the options. Then select **Done** to close the window.

Tip: If the screen image seems jumpy or hard to follow, use the When Pointer Reaches Edge option at first.
