Digital Crown

Learn to use this handy control to quickly navigate your apps and more.

The Digital Crown works as a button to toggle in and out of apps, VoiceOver, and more. **Try it out!**

1. To begin, open the **Accessibility** settings in the **Apple Watch app** on your iPhone and make sure the **VoiceOver** setting is turned on.

Single-Pressing the Digital Crown

2. Press the **Digital Crown** once to go to the app home screen. Your Apple Watch apps are displayed alphabetically in list view, and **VoiceOver** announces the first one.
3. Right-swipe or left-swipe to scroll through your apps.

Tip: You can choose to have your apps displayed in a grid instead of a list. Scroll to the bottom of the app list and choose the Grid View button.

4. To open the app that's highlighted and announced by **VoiceOver**, double tap the watch face with one finger.
5. To close an open app and return to the app list, press the **Digital Crown** once.
6. Press the **Digital Crown** once more to return to the watch face.

Double Pressing the Digital Crown

7. Press the **Digital Crown** twice to go to the **App Switcher**, which displays a list of your recently opened apps.
8. Right-swipe and left-swipe to move through the list. Double tap to open an app.
9. Press the **Digital Crown** once to close the **App Switcher** and return to the watch face.

Triple Pressing the Digital Crown

10. Triple press the **Digital Crown** to toggle on or off the accessibility shortcut you've set, such as **VoiceOver** or **Zoom**.

Pressing and Holding the Digital Crown

11. Press and hold the **Digital Crown** to activate Siri.

Tip: You might recognize that some of these gestures are a lot like using the iPhone. This helps make them easier to remember!
